My trip to Greece this year will always stand out as one of the most meaningful adventures of my life, not just because of where we went, but because of why we went. For me, it was a reminder of how far we'd come, how much we'd grown, and a sneak peek into all the adventures we still have to look forward to.


MARGO'S TRIP TO






ERIKA'S TRIP TO
